

## ORDINANCE # 13-3

### AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PRIORITY CLASSIFICATION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS

**WHEREAS**, counties are permitted to under state law to designate noxious weeds; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and landowners of Daggett County to establish a priority classification to assist in the eradication and/or control of certain noxious weeds.

**NOW THEREFORE** the County Legislative Body of Daggett County Ordains As Follows:

#### SECTION 1. Priority Classification of Noxious Weeds.
