Commissioners' Corner

On April 18th a new event came to Daggett County. Ken Garff Motors, through their non-profit foundation Success in Education, developed and hosted a Fishin' the Green event to benefit their Keys to Success and Road to Success programs. The main purpose of the event was to raise funds for the charity. The Commission supported this event for the marketing of the area. The Governor and 1st Lady attended the event in support of the mission of the non-profit. Sixty executives and several media outlets participated in the event and for the most part had a great time fishing and enjoying the Green River despite some snowy and cold weather. Hooked on Utah aired footage of the event on Saturday, April 27th, 2013. The Road to Success program will be coming to Daggett Elementary schools in the fall thanks to this very successful fundraiser. It is anticipated that this will be an annual event that will continue to benefit the Foundation and Daggett County.

The Commission has also supported a program called "Utah's Bucket List", which should be airing in August. It features the Green River as one of Utah's "must visit" locations. The County and the Chamber of Commerce have been working together to promote the area as KSL has been in the area filming and will return to Red Canyon Overlook on May 10th at 5 am for a live feed of the sunrise. KUTV Road Tripping program will be back again at the end of May with a June 6th air date. It is anticipated that funding will be applied for through the State's Cooperative Marketing program to continue to market the Flaming Gorge area to those outside of Utah. Businesses and others interested in these marketing efforts are encouraged to join and participate in the Flaming Gorge Chamber.

The County, through the Economic Development Office and Emergency Management Department, and in conjunction with the Flaming Gorge Chamber of Commerce have held several trainings over the last couple of months and more are being scheduled. Additional information can be found on the County website at: www.daggettcountry.org/trainings.

Within a few days, the Commission will send a letter to the Department of Interior formally protesting the sequestration of payments made to States mandated under Chapter 30 of United States Code, Section 191 (Mineral Lease Payments). The Commission believes it may not be legal to sequester funds collected under the Federal Oil and Gas Royalty Management Act of 1982.

The Commission also recently met with local BLM management as they prepare to begin the transportation planning. The timing of this ties in nicely with a recreation audit the Commission has recently approved. More information on both projects will be released as it becomes available.

The Commission has also been working with the Conservation District on weed control and the continued development of Agricultural Protection Zones. More information can be found about these items and a Conservation District grant program within this newsletter.



The Daggett Conservation District Grants Funding of \$3,000

The Daggett Conservation District recently approved funding of \$3,000 for multiple grants available to the public for conservation and natural resource projects. The intent is to promote and encourage projects that improve and enhance Daggett County. Suggested projects may include but are not limited to: beautification for public enjoyment, water quality improvements, erosion control, wildlife habitat improvement, tree plantings (wind breaks), reseeding projects, youth projects, recycling programs, educationally related projects, etc. Any conservation, natural resource, or educational requests will be considered.

Individual grants will be issued for a value of up to \$1,000. Groups or individuals may apply. Applicants may partner with other organizations for the proposed project. However, the main responsibility of reporting will lie with the applying applicant. Projects may be done on private or public land, provided proper permission is provided. Grants must benefit conservation or natural resource improvements and may NOT be used for personal monetary gain.

Only costs directly related to the project are eligible for funding. Ineligible expenses would include labor, meals, advertising, etc. A description of the project and projected budget will need to be submitted with the application. Projects costs will be applied to the grant (up to \$1,000) based on actual receipts submitted, unused budget money may not be claimed.

Upon completion of the project, applicants are required to submit a written report to the DCD Board at a regularly scheduled meeting before receiving grant funds. Before and after photographs are required of completed projects.

Applications are available at the Daggett County Courthouse, the Town of Manila office. or by emailing Carol Gardiner at carolga3@hotmail.com.

All applications are due by May 6th, 2013 and will be reviewed at the May 8th, Board meeting. Funds must be used by October 1st, 2013.

Obituary

Farren F. Boren



Farren F. Boren, 90, passed away Saturday, April 20, 2013 in Corpus Christi, TX, where he spent his winters. He summered at his home in Cheyenne, WY. He was born December 22, 1922 in White Rocks, UT, to Alma LeRoy and Thelma (Potter) Boren. He was raised in Manila, UT, and graduated from Manila High School. During high school, he helped work the family ranch "South Valley". He was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

He married Erma Peterson in 1942 in Green River, WY. They later divorced. Mr. Boren served in the U.S. Army during WWII as a rifleman (scout), 25 Division, 27 Infantry in Luzon, Philippines from 1944 to 1946. After the war, he and his wife moved to Green River, WY where they had seven children. He worked for the Union Pacific Railroad as an Electrician until 1962. He then earned a degree in cosmetology in Ogden, UT. He opened his first shop in Big Piney, WY, and later in Cheyenne, WY, until his retirement in 1995.

He married Shirley Hoover in 1963; they divorced. He married Alice Reed in 1970. She

passed away in 2000. In his youth, he played basketball for the Manila Mustangs and later for the Green River Men's Leagues. He was a square dance caller for the Green River Sashay's from 1958-1960. He was in various bowling leagues and an avid water skier. He loved hunting and fishing and enjoyed golfing up to the age of 89. His interests were watching the Rockies Baseball team, riding his side-by-side and singing karaoke.

He is survived by his companion of 12 years, Carol Lough, his sons: David and wife Laurie of South Weber, UT; Robert and wife Carolyn of Green River, WY; and Stanley and wife Shirley of Encinata, CA. His daughters: Beverley and husband Bill Miller of Rock Springs, WY; Sandra and husband Mike Kovach of Pinedale, WY; and Sharon Gerdes of Fruit Heights, UT, 17 grandchildren, 18 great-grandchildren, and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Roy and Thelma, his son Michael, his great-grandson Heston, brother Lonnie and wife Vera, sister Esther and husband Donald Larsen and brother Argie.



DAGGETT COUNTY JOINS NHTSA AND OTHER GROUPS IN PROMOTING MOTORCYCLE SAFETY

'Share the Road' Campaign Highlights Mutual Safety Responsibilities of All Highway Users

In recognition of May as Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, Daggett County Emergency Management reminds motorists and motorcyclists alike to "share the road" conscientiously and courteously to help prevent motorcycle crashes. Safety is a mutual responsibility for motorists and motorcyclists alike. Motorcyclists are about 30 times more likely to die in a crash than passenger vehicle occupants, so whether you are driving the family sedan, an SUV, a school bus, a delivery van, or an 18-wheeler, drivers should always be on the lookout for motorcyclists. Drivers must be aware that a motorcycle, as one of the smallest of vehicles on the road, can be 'hiding' in your vehicle's blind spots. Always check blind spots, use mirrors and signal before changing lanes or making turns.

Motorcycle fatalities in 2011 showed a continued increase to 4,612. Motorcycle fatalities accounted for 14 percent of total highway deaths for the year despite motorcycle registrations representing only about 3 percent of all vehicles in the U.S.

Tips for drivers to help keep motorcyclists safe on our roadways.

- Remember, a motorcycle is a vehicle with all of the rights and privileges of any other motor vehicle. The person under that helmet could be a mother, brother, doctor, or friend;
- Always allow a motorcyclist the full lane width—never try to share a lane;
- Perform a regular visual check for motorcycles by checking mirrors and blind spots before entering or exiting a lane of traffic, and at intersections;
- Always signal your intentions before changing lanes or merging with traffic;
- Don't be fooled by a flashing turn signal on a motorcycle – motorcycle signals are often not self-canceling and riders sometimes forget to turn them off. Wait to be sure the motorcycle is going to turn before you proceed;
- Allow more following distance - three or four seconds - when behind a motorcycle to give the motorcyclist time to maneuver around obstacles in the roadway, or stop in an emergency;
- Never drive distracted.

Motorcyclists can increase their safety by:

- Wearing a DOT-compliant helmet;
- Using turn signals for every turn or lane change, even if the rider thinks no one will see it;
- Signaling intentions by combining hand signals and turn signals to draw more attention to themselves;
- Wearing brightly colored protective gear, and using reflective tape and stickers to increase conspicuity;
- Positioning themselves in the lane where they will be most visible to other drivers; and
- Never riding while impaired or distracted.
