## New Cell Phone Ban for Teen Drivers

A new law restricts cell phone use for drivers under the age of 18. Read more about the law at <http://le.utah.gov/~2013/bills/hbillenr/HB0103.htm> Remember that it is best practice for everyone to refrain from cell phone use while driving. An estimated 1 in 4 crashes involve cell phone use. To ensure the safety of yourself and those around you:

- Refrain from calling, texting or emailing while driving - even with a hands-free device
- Indicate on your voicemail that you are driving and give people a time when you will be available
- If you are talking to someone you know is driving, tell him/her to hang up and call you back when they are no longer behind the wheel

## Commissioners' Corner

For the last few months the Commissioner's have been working on a Proposal to participate in Congressman Bishop's proposed Congressional Lands Bill. The Bill that Congressman Bishop is working on sort-of considers land as currency. With so much of our County land owned by Federal and State agencies, we feel that this Bill could be of great benefit to our future well-being and growth.

We are now at a point that we feel it is imperative to have public input on the Draft of this proposal. A copy of the draft can be emailed to you by any one of the Commissioners or you can stop by and see us in person and we will print you a copy. This is your County and it is important that your opinions are heard and included in this decision making process.

At this point and time there are ten (10) items in the proposal:

1. Include the South banks of sections "A" and "B" of the Green River to Indian Crossing in the NRA.
2. Sell the BLM property known as Jarvie Ranch to either the County or a private entity for future maintenance and growth.
3. Inclusion of the Green River from 0.5 miles below the Dam to Indian Crossing in the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System under the "Scenic" designation.
4. Designate 20,500 acres on Baretop Mountain as a National Wilderness Area.
5. Designate Diamond Breaks as a National Wilderness Area.
6. Release Cold Springs as a Wilderness Study Area.
7. Privatize approximately 6,800 Acres of Forest Service land to be developed as a Summer and Winter Recreation area.
8. Privatize the Sweat Ranch while maintaining the historic value.
9. Release the Green River from Indian Crossing to the Colorado State line from consideration as a "recreational" river.
10. Transfer SITLA parcels located within designated portions of the Green River watershed to the State of Utah where they may be developed.

As you can see this proposal consists of give and take. At this point and time we feel what we are offering will balance with what we are asking for, which will be extremely important in Congress.

There will be a Public Hearing to consider this proposal on July 9<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 am in the Commissioner's Chambers. Please feel free to contact us before that date with any questions or concerns you may have. We can also provide you with a current Draft of the Proposal.

The Flaming Gorge Recreation Service re-opened under new ownership on August 30th, 2012. The new owners have recently enlarged and updated the Café section of their facility. The rustic look is very inviting and the pictures added to the tables make it fun. Currently, they are in the process of building 15 single two (2) bedroom units that are located near Highway 191. These units will be built in groups of three and will face different directions giving privacy and a feeling of uniqueness for each unit. They will have a common courtyard in the center with Barbeque pits. The first of these units should be ready by mid July. They are going to be landscaped with streams and trees, which are ordered and will be planted this summer or fall.





Another project in the works is to create a Shower House and Laundry facility for the RV Camping. They have purchased a portable unit that they are going to refurbish and landscape. The RV camping will be enlarged. The storage area is planned on being relocated to another part of the property.



Eventually, there will be several 8-plex units. A hotel and restaurant will be located in front of the rock formation at the base of the hill.

There are plans posted on one wall of their Café, so, drop in and check them out.



**Governor Herbert Declared a Fire Restriction Order through the State Forester, Dick Buehler. This restriction applies to Daggett County. The only place in Daggett County that is incorporated is the Town of Manila.**

## Fire Restriction Order

Due to current and forecasted weather conditions coupled with the extremely dry conditions in the affected areas, the Utah State Forester has determined that measures must be taken to prevent costly and damaging forest and rangeland fires. Therefore, pursuant to Utah State Law, Section 65A-8-212 Utah Code 1994. The following acts are prohibited on the areas, roads and trails described below until rescinded by the Utah State Forester:

**1. Discharging, or using any kind of fireworks.**

Within the following area description:

All unincorporated state and private lands within the State of Utah located in Box Elder, Cache, Daggett, Davis, Duchesne, Juab, Millard, Morgan, Piute, Salt Lake, Sanpete, Sevier, Summit, Tooele, Uintah, Utah, Wasatch and Wayne counties.

**2. Setting, building, maintaining, attending or using open fires of any kind, except campfires built within the facilities constructed for them in improved campgrounds, picnic areas or residential structures.**

**3. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared to mineral soil.**

**4. Discharging, or using any kind of fireworks, tracer ammunition or other pyrotechnic devices including explosive targets.**

**5. Cutting, welding, or grinding metal in areas of dry vegetation.**

### Improve Your Gas Mileage

**1. Drive More Efficiently**

- Avoid speeding, rapid acceleration, and unnecessary braking
- Observe the speed limit
- Avoid idling
- Remove unnecessary items that add weight to your vehicle
- Use cruise control on the highway
- Use overdrive gears when appropriate

**2. Keep Your Car in Shape**


- Get regular tune-ups

## Lightning Safety and Outdoor Sports Activities

Sports officials must understand thunderstorms and lightning to ensure they make educated decisions on when to seek safety. Without this knowledge, officials base their decisions on personal experience and the desire to complete the activity. The National Weather Service recommends officials of organized sports have a lightning safety plan they follow without exception. The plan should give clear, specific safety guidelines to eliminate errors in judgment. The guidelines should address the following questions:

- When should activities be stopped?
- Where should people go for safety?
- When should activities be resumed?
- Who should monitor the weather and who decides when to stop activities?
- What should be done if someone is struck by lightning?

Before an event, organizers should listen to the latest forecast to determine the likelihood of thunderstorms. A NOAA Weather Radio is a good source of up-to-date weather information. If thunderstorms are forecast, organizers should consider canceling or postponing the activity. Once people start to arrive at an event, the guidelines in the lightning safety plan should be followed. The National Weather Service has developed several [lightning safety toolkits](#) groups can use to develop their safety plan. Below is some information to consider when making a lightning safety plan.

### Stopping Activities

In general, a significant lightning threat extends outward from the base of a thunderstorm cloud about 6 to 10 miles. Therefore, people should be in a safe place when a thunderstorm is 6 to 10 miles away. Also, A plan's guidelines should account for the time it will take for everyone to get to safety. Here are some criteria that could be used to stop activities:

- **If you see lightning.** The ability to see lightning varies depending on the time of day, weather conditions, and obstructions such as trees, mountains, etc. In clear air, and especially at night, lightning can be seen from storms more than 10 miles away provided that obstructions don't limit the view of the thunderstorm.
- **If you hear thunder.** Thunder can usually be heard for a distance of about 10 miles provided that there is no background noise. Traffic, wind, and precipitation may limit the ability to hear thunder to less than 10 miles. If you hear thunder, though, it's a safe bet that the storm is within ten miles.
- **If skies look threatening.** Thunderstorms can develop directly overhead and some storms may develop.

### Seeking Safe Shelter

No place OUTSIDE is safe in or near a thunderstorm. Stop what you are doing and get to a safe place immediately. **Small outdoor buildings including dugouts, rain shelters, sheds, etc., are NOT SAFE. Substantial buildings** with wiring and plumbing are the safest places. Office buildings, schools, and homes offer good protection. Once inside, stay away from windows and doors and anything that conducts electricity such as corded phones, wiring, plumbing, and anything connected to these. A **hard-topped metal vehicle** with the windows closed also provides good protection. Avoid contact with metal in the vehicle and try to keep away from windows.

### Resuming Activities

Because electrical charges can linger in clouds after a thunderstorm has passed, experts agree that people should wait at least 30 minutes after the storm before resuming activities.

### Monitoring the Weather and Making Decisions

Lightning safety plans should specify that someone be designated to monitor the weather for lightning. The 'lightning monitor' should not be the coach, umpire, or referee, since they busy doing other things and can't adequately monitor conditions. . The 'lightning monitor' must know the plan's guidelines and be empowered to follow the guidelines.

### Helping Lightning Victims

Most victims can survive a lightning strike; however, medical attention may be needed immediately. Call for medical help. Victims do not carry an electrical charge. In many cases, the victim's heart or breathing may have stopped. CPR or an AED may be needed to revive them. Continue to monitor the victim until medical help arrives. If possible, move the victim to a safer place away from the threat of another lightning strike.
