

ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF DAGGETT STATE OF UTAH

ORDINANCES 1 THRU 12

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Daggett ordains as follows:

Ordinance No. 1. Regular meetings of the Board--Special meetings

Regular meetings of the board of County Commissioners shall be held once each month at the county seat at manila. Unless ordered otherwise by the chairman or the members of the board, the regular meetings shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month. If at any time the business of the county requires a special meeting of the board, such meeting may be ordered by a majority of the board or by the chairman thereof. All meetings of the board must be public, and the books, records and accounts must be kept at the office of the clerk, open at all times during usual business hours for public inspection. (R.S. 19-5-6)

Ordinance No. 2. Order of business at commissioners meetings.

The order of business at each regular meeting, which shall not in any case be departed from, except by consent of a majority of the members present, voting thereon, shall be as follows:

First. Reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting and of all intervening meetings, correction, amendment and approval of same.

Second. Unfinished business.

Third. Reports of County officers.

Forth. Presentation of petitions and communications by those wishing to meet with the board.

Fifth. Miscellaneous business.

The chairman shall preserve order, confine members in debate to the question, and shall decide who shall be first heard, when two or more members arise at the same time. Every question submitted to the board for consideration shall be heard in the most concise manner and long drawn out communication unnecessary in the deciding of any question shall at once be abated by the chairman without debate unless there is an appeal made, in which case the board shall decide without debate. When a question is before the board no motion shall be received, except as herein specified, which motions shall have precedence in the order state, viz:

First. To adjourn.

Second. The previous question.

Third. To lay on the table.

Fourth. To amend.

Ordinance No. 3. Ordinance Book

The clerk of the board of County Commissioners must keep an ordinance book. The title of which shall be "Ordinances of the County of Daggett". All ordinances passed by the board must be recorded in the ordinance book at length, with the number and title of each ordinance. The ordinance book shall be open to public inspection during all usual business hours. (19-5-16 R.S.)

Ordinance No. 4. Franchises

There shall be kept a record by the clerk of the board of all franchises granted by the board, for what purpose, the length of time, and to whom granted, the amount of bond and the license tax required or other consideration to be paid. (R.S. 19-5-16)

Ordinance No. 5. Precincts-- Election Districts

The precincts, election districts, school representation precincts and all other subdivisions of the county as they exist or as they existed January 1, 1935, are hereby recognized. The county surveyor must make a map of the county showing all precincts together with all other subdivisions and all county roads. Which map shall be an official map and shall constitute the subdivisions of the county hereby created. (R.S. 19-5-17)

Ordinance No. 6. Adoption of seal of County Clerk.

That a seal, the impression of which shall be as follows, to-wit: "State of Utah County Clerk County of Daggett" shall be and is hereby adopted and declared to be the seal of the County Clerk. An impression of the seal must be filed in the office of the County Clerk. (R.S. 19-5-25)

Ordinance No. 7. Consolidation of County Offices.

The offices of County Clerk, County Recorder, and County Treasurer are hereby consolidated. But one person shall be elected to fill the foregoing offices so united and consolidated, and he must

take the oath and give the bond required for, and discharged all the duties pertaining to, each. The salary for the offices so consolidated and united shall be nine hundred (900) dollars per year.

Ordinance No. 8. Salaries.

The annual salaries of the officers of the county are hereby adopted and declared to be as follows:

Commissioners, each	\$60
Sheriff	\$200
Assessor	\$300
Clerk, Recorder	
Treasurer	\$900
Attorney	\$100

Ordinance No. 9. Lawful Fence.

No fence in the county of Daggett shall be lawful unless it conforms to the following specification: Posts one rod apart. Four barbed wire with barbs five inches apart commonly known as cattle wire stapled or securely fastened to each post. Wires should be spaced evenly to a height of four and one-half feet for the top wire. Provided, that if more wires are had, if the fence contains more posts, if the fence is of a different style but of an equivalent amount of material or more, if the fence is of the same quality, it shall be declared a lawful fence. But in no case is a fence lawful that is inferior to the above specifications. If a question arises as to a fence being lawful, upon a petition of an interested person, the County Commissioners shall appoint a committee to decide if the fence is lawful. (R.S. 3-5-78)

Ordinance No. 10. Throwing down Fence--A Misdemeanor.

Any person, other than the owner or his agent or employee or other person duly authorized, who cuts, throws down, or makes a gap in any fence contrary to the desire of any person, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be liable for the damages resulting therefrom and shall be fined not less than twenty five dollars nor more than two hundred and ninety nine dollars or shall be imprisoned not to exceed six months.

Ordinance No. 11. Standard for Measuring Hay.

The standard for the Measurement of hay in the County of Daggett shall be as follows: Hay in the stack after sixty days and before one year from the date it was stacked, 422 cubic feet per ton; hay in the stack less than sixty days stacked, 512 cubic feet per ton; hay in the stack more than one year stacked, 382 cubic feet per ton; hay measured in a hay rack, 512 cubic feet per ton. It shall be the standard in Daggett County, when measuring hay in a stack, to obtain the height of the stack, subtract the width from the over-cast, which shall be taken from the ground on one side near the base of the stack over the stack to the ground on the other side near the base of the stack in as many places as the circumstances require, and divide by two which dividend shall be the average height of the stack.

(R.S. 19-5-32)

Ordinance No. 12. Repealing Clause.

Any ordinance, resolution, or ruling adopted by the Board of

County Commissioners, prior to the passing of these ordinance, known as "Ordinances of Daggett County", which are repugnant to these the ordinances of Daggett County, or any ordinance which in the lapse of time have become obsolete or inoperative, are hereby repealed.
