Flaming Gorge Tourism Conference

The Daggett County Economic Development Office and the Flaming Gorge Chamber worked together on the Flaming Gorge Tourism Conference which was held on September 20, 2013. One local business owner said: "Loved it - the resources were amazing - best conference yet!" Another said: "The speakers were absolutely great - lots of

ideas for Daggett Co. to better themselves." The theme was **"Developing Your Tourism Toolkit"** and each speaker addressed that in one way or another.

Vicki Varela, Managing Director of the State of Utah's Tourism Office (UOT) since February of 2013 spoke on the State's efforts to promote Utah as a Destination for national and international travelers and tied in some practical ideas from Roger Brooks to get businesses noticed. David Williams, Deputy Director at UOT spoke on the States' Cooperative Marketing program and other Cooperative tools that local businesses could use to promote Flaming Gorge. Jay Kinghorn, UOT Director of Communications and Digital Media addressed free or very inexpensive ways of digitally marketing tourism businesses. Lesha Coltharp of Uintah County Tourism Office spoke about the many projects Uintah County and Daggett County have cooperated on and upcoming projects for the future. She gave attendees more marketing ideas. A discussion followed where different ways of cooperating with other tourism businesses were explored. Lunch was provided by Brownings and the Sponsors (Uintah Basin Association of Governments, Mountain America Credit Union, Outdoor Utah Adventure Guide, Bridger Valley Electric Association, Trout Unlimited, and The Clinic - Uintah Basin Medical Center) were given a moment to promote their businesses.

The afternoon session started with Rick Folkerson, of Garff Automotive Group and Success in Education sharing marketing concepts and reinforcing what the other presenters had shared. Rick also spoke about the upcoming Burbot Bash and how businesses can get involved in that event. Joey Klein of the International Mountain Biking Association (IMBA) spoke about the drawing power of "purpose-built" mountain bike trails and a proposed project for our area. Loretta Gale of Infobytes.com spoke about a new initiative for small businesses to get online, while Jennifer Wakeland of Salt City Emporium talked about how Instagram got her business going and well recognized.

On May 14, 2013 the County Commissioners approved and signed Resolution 13-11 "Approving the Adoption and Support of the Daggett County Covenant to Honor and Celebrate the Military Men and Women of Daggett County and Their Families, and All Military Men and Women, and Their Families Who Have Served, or Are Presently Serving in the Military, and Thereby Courageously Supporting and Defending Our Country and Daggett County." On September 10th 1st Lt. Michael G. Williams of the U.S. Army came to Commission meeting to have the Commissioners sign the Covenant and to encourage recognition of those who have served and/or are currently serving and acknowledge the sacrifice of their families during their service.

Ashley National Forest Prepares for Fall Prescribed Burning

Vernal, Utah ... The Ashley National Forest is preparing for prescribed fires on the Vernal and Flaming Gorge Ranger Districts beginning on September 8th through the end of November.

Implementation of prescribed fire is dependent on the correct weather conditions. Currently there are two Prescribed Fire Plans pending implementation on the Vernal Ranger District. The first project area to meet the weather condition requirements will be implemented. Project areas include:

Potholes: Lies on the Vernal Ranger District, just north of the Diamond Mountain Rd, East of HWY 191, South of Bowden Draw, and West of the Forest boundary. This is approximately 27 miles north of Vernal, Utah. Prescription area will include the Limber Flag, Potholes and Limestone drainages. This prescribed burn will benefit wildlife foraging habitat, reduce the potential for extreme wildland fire and re-introduce the role of fire into the ecosystem. Total treatment area is 6,000 acres.

Alma Taylor: Lies on the Vernal Ranger District, approximately 15 miles northwest of Vernal, Utah off Forest Service Road 018, in the Charley's Park area. Prescription plan is the removal of slash piles or like woody deposits. Total treatment area is 500 acres.

Currently there are three Prescribed Fire Plans pending implementation on the Flaming Gorge Ranger District. The first project area to meet the weather condition requirements will be implemented.

Honslinger: The Honslinger unit lies on the Flaming Gorge Ranger District, just south of the Hwy 44 in the Deep Creek area, East of Ute tower and Brownie Lake, north of Summit Park, and West of Little Elk Creek. This is approximately 10 miles south of Manila, Utah. The prescription area will include south of Forest Road 539, east of the Little Elk drainage, and west of Forest Road 628. This prescribed burn will benefit wildlife foraging habitat, reduce the potential for extreme wildland fire and re-introduce fire into the ecosystem. Total treatment area is approximately 1,200 acres.

North Flank: Lies on the Flaming Gorge Ranger District, approximately 13 miles southeast of Manila, Utah off Forest Service Road 221 to Spirit Lake. The targeted units for this year of the North Flank units include the area just north of Long Park Lake. This prescribed burn will benefit wildlife foraging habitat, reduce the potential for extreme wildland fire and re-introduce fire into the ecosystem. Total treatment area is 4,100 acres with approximately 1,500 targeted for this fiscal year.

Arch Dam Campsite: Lies on the Flaming Gorge Ranger District, approximately 1 mile southwest of Dutch John, Utah off Highway 191, in the Arch Dam area. Prescription plan is the removal of slash piles or like woody deposits. Total treatment area is 464 acres.

Burl and Ida Twitchell, Grand Marshalls of the Daggett Daze Parade were honored with a ride in a 1969 Chevrolet Impala driven by Jesse Coombs from Whistler Chevrolet.

Both families are long time residents of Daggett County. The first Twitchells arrived into the valley in 1898, Burl's family moved from White Rocks in the Uintah Basin in 1936, when Burl was two years old. The family were ranchers.

Ida's family (the Biorns) moved from Ashton, Idaho to Manila in 1938, when Ida was one year old. The Biorns had a lumber mill and later a construction business.

Burl and Ida were married in October 1952. This October, they will celebrate 61 years of marriage. They have 6 children, 17 grandchildren and 27 great-grand children.

Both Burl and Ida have contributed much to the community. Ida Spent 16 years working in the schools. Three of these years were working in the school cafeteria and the other 13 years where spent in the elementary as a Para Educator. Here she was able to instill in the students the love she has for good books. Ida also served 21 years on the Town of Manila City Council.

Burl worked construction on the Flaming Gorge Dam. He then worked for the Park Service and later the Forest Service. After working a combined 31 years for the federal government, he retired and then continued working 14 years for the county. During those 14 years, Burl was instrumental in building the City Park, improving the rodeo grounds and the Town Cemetery.
