## Senior All-Star Game Honors Honor Manila Athletes

At the conclusion of each basketball season, the Utah Women's Basketball Coaches Association (UWBCA) hosts the annual Senior All-Star game at Taylorsville High School. Coaches from around the state vote for the student

-athletes they feel deserve the recognition of the All-Star game. The ten seniors that receive the most votes from each classification are invited to attend the event.

Rebecca Collett and Ashlee Hullinger were both voted by coaches around the state to represent 1A in this year's All-Star game on March 22. For the 2013-2014 season, Rebecca Collett averaged 12.7 points per game as well as 16.7 rebounds per game. Ashlee Hullinger averaged 6.17 points per game, with a team leading 5.4 assists per game. Collett and Hullinger joined players from Rich, Piute, Valley, St. Joseph, Bryce Valley, and Wayne in the game against the 2A All-Stars.

Collett and Hullinger talk about the experience. "The opportunity to play on the 1A Senior All-Star game was a great conclusion to the basketball season. What an honor it was to be chosen by the coaches from around the state, and to wear our uniforms one last time to represent Manila and the pride we have in our school. Playing in that last game was an amazing reward for all of the hard work and extra time we had put into the sport of basketball.

"It was an incredible experience to play *with* some of the best players we had been playing *against* throughout the season. We thought it was fun to get to know some of the senior girls from other schools and to be coached by the Bryce Valley coach, Tyson Brinkerhoff, and assisted by Scott Ferguson of Rich High School. It was exciting to play with some of the best guards and posts from around the state, but it also helped us realize that here in Manila, we truly do have the greatest coaches and some really special girls."

Rebecca Collett and Ashlee Hullinger were also selected for the All-Region team in Region 17. Coach Mike Hughes was honored as the 2013-2014 Region 17 Coach of the Year. Congratulations to Coach Hughes and his basketball team this year for their hard work, exceptional journey, and success!

## Commissioner's Corner

### IS DAGGETT COUNTY GOING BROKE?

We hear all the rumors, emails and on rare occasions are asked this question in Commission Meetings. Most of the information that is being passed around is incorrect. The county is not going broke. We need to be conservative and cut back on spending whenever possible, but what government entity should not do this? All forms of government should be fiscally responsible. It is not their money; it is the taxpayer's money.

It needs to be understood that the yearly budget is not all the money the county has. It is just what has been allocated for the year for county business and tracking where those revenues will come from. It doesn't show all of the fund balances; those are contained in financial statements which can be obtained from the Auditor/Recorder's office. These are available to the public at any time during regular business hours.

The general fund always has a fund balance above the yearly budget equal to one year of property taxes. Other funds, such as the rural hospital tax fund, can only be expended on certain services and equipment types and will have fund balances which reflect the yearly needs of that service. The "B" road fund can only be expended on those roads or equipment that is used to work on those roads. Money is normally reserved in this fund to purchase equipment.

Each year after the budget is certified, it is sent to the State Auditor's office and reviewed to ensure we are meeting legal guidelines. We are also independently audited every year. The budget may seem complicated, but when you have to account for every penny that is expended and where it comes from, it is bound to be. To simplify the budget and comingle funds allows for pilfering and could be a temptation for illegal activity. There is a reason for so many line items. It supports accountability and proper tracking of funds.

If you don't want to make your way down to the Courthouse to garner more information, the most accurate website is Transparent Utah ([www.utah.gov/transparency](http://www.utah.gov/transparency)). This is a State of Utah website and the county updates information to it quarterly. Many people go to the right to know website and much of that is incorrect and not reported directly by counties.

Much of what we have viewed in emails is very misleading and we don't know the rationale behind the individuals that send out this misinformation, but it is unfortunate that they feel the need to do it. If you have questions, the best place to obtain factual answers is the above mentioned website or the Courthouse. We do work for you.

NOAA's [National Weather Service](#) meteorologists across the country could use a hand — or more precisely extra eyes — to help them produce the most accurate weather information possible. If you are fascinated by weather, you have the opportunity to become a trained volunteer [SKYWARN®](#) storm spotter for your local weather forecast office.

**Your Eyes on the Skies:** Storm spotters provide valuable information on all types of weather hazards to meteorologists in their local National Weather Service forecast offices. Meteorologists use this information, especially when it comes to severe storms, to create a more complete picture of area weather conditions. The SKYWARN program helps improve the timeliness and accuracy of weather warnings. When coupled with Doppler radar imagery, satellite and other data, reports from storm spotters help forecasters know exactly what is happening on the ground with rapidly developing storms. “The more lead time we can provide with our warnings, the more time people have to take cover from life-threatening storms,” says Christopher Maier, who oversees the national SKYWARN program.



### Ryan's Green River "office window"

Ryan's Green River "office window" for a couple of nights Last month. Pictured on the front of the boat doing the netting (hard labor) are Molly Ryan of the US Forest Service and Kevin Clegg from Flaming Gorge Resort. Just another example of cooperative effort to get the job done. It was the Green River's version of Deadliest Catch (minus the ending pay-out) as Mother Nature threw everything she had at the team including wind, pouring rain, and thunder and lightning. Fortunately they finished with nothing more than a few bumps and bruises.

This completes the DNR's spring fishery assessment via electro fishing below Flaming Gorge Dam. They collected a total of 477 fish at Spillway and 400 fish at Little Hole, up slightly from what was collected last fall. The fish looked good and healthy, most notably rainbow trout. They sampled more fish at Spillway, but overall bigger fish at Little Hole including brown trout up to 23-inches and 4lbs, rainbow trout up to 19-inches and 2.5 lbs, and whitefish up to 20-inches and 2.75 lbs. With the abundance of blue-winged olive hatches right now, it's a good time to visit and throw a dry fly for some quality fish!

Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) can be aquatic animals such as zebra and quagga mussels or rusty crayfish, or aquatic vegetation such as hydrilla. These AIS can have far-reaching impacts on our water resources. Many of these species permanently change stream and lake ecology, negatively affecting native species and our prized sport fisheries. Zebra and quagga mussels can attach to water infrastructure and equipment causing damage. These species are often called "aquatic hitchhikers" because they can hitch a ride on boats, equipment, or in any water that is not drained.

The Wyoming Game and Fish Department is offering several watercraft inspection trainings in 2014. These trainings will provide the skills necessary to inspect your own watercraft and certify you to inspect other watercraft as well. The trainings include information on basic biology, impacts, transport vectors and distribution of AIS. It includes classroom instruction, a question and answer session, and a hands-on watercraft inspection exercise.

The trainings are free and open to anyone interested in preventing the spread of AIS through watercraft inspection. These trainings are being offered as a one-day course (9:00a - 4:00p). Registration deadline is one week prior to the class start date. Limited to 20 people per course.
