Commissioner’s Corner

This time of year most people tend to focus on family, friends and the Holiday Season. I personally love this time of year. My family is steeped with traditions surrounding the Holiday’s and it is one of the times that many of us make time to get together. We are lucky to live in an area where we can cut our own perfect Christmas trees and make it a fun family event. There are many celebrations and events taking place in our communities so make sure to check all of the various calendars.

The Commission, however, focuses on the Budget this time of year. There will be a public hearing in Commission meeting on December 8th concerning next year’s budget. We encourage citizens to come and find out how the County spends the money that they pay in. It is our nature to complain about things that we feel we have no control over, but if you get involved, you will find you do have some control. The Commission welcomes comments and advice.

We will also be rebidding the Water Tank replacement project for Dutch John in January. The Commission had to resubmit to the Water Board for an increase in funds for this project, as all of the primary bids were higher than the funding we originally received. 50% of this project is being funded with a grant and the other 50% is a loan, which the County will have to pay back over a 30 year period. We will have to restructure the utility payments of the users in order to cover this cost. There will be a public hearing concerning this project during the December 22nd Commission meeting.

The Declaration of Candidacy Filing period for qualified political party candidates begins on Friday, March 11, 2016 and ends at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, March 17, 2016 and;

The Declaration of Candidacy filing period for state and local school board candidates begins on Monday, January 4, 2016 and ends at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, March 17, 2016, and;

The Declaration of Candidacy filing period for Justices and Judges of a Court of record begins Friday, April 1, 2016 and ends at 5:00 p.m., Friday, April 15, 2016, and;

The Declaration of Intent to Gather Signatures period for qualified political party candidates begins on Monday, January 4, 2016 and ends at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, March 17, 2016 and:

Candidates must submit nomination petition signatures no later than 14 days before the day on which the qualified political party holds its convention to select candidates for the elective office.

Best Toffee Ever - Super Easy

"Chocolate and almonds top off a rich buttery toffee. A simple recipe that you could easily remember and whip up any time. I always get compliments and requests for more. Use any type of nut that you like in place of the almonds."

Ingredients

- 2 cups butter
- 2 cups white sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup finely chopped almonds



Directions

In a large heavy bottomed saucepan, combine the butter, sugar and salt. Cook over medium heat, stirring until the butter is melted. Allow to come to a boil, and cook until the mixture becomes a **dark amber color**, and the temperature has reached 285 degrees F (137 degrees C). Stir constantly! This is KEY to this recipe!
 While the toffee is cooking, cover a large baking sheet with aluminum foil or parchment paper.
 As soon as the toffee reaches the proper temperature, pour it out onto the prepared baking sheet. Sprinkle the chocolate over the top, and let it set for a minute or two to soften. Spread the chocolate into a thin even layer once it is melted. Sprinkle the nuts over the chocolate, and press in slightly. Putting a plastic bag over your hand will minimize the mess.
 Place the toffee in the refrigerator to chill until set. Break into pieces, and store in an airtight container.

Win Cash and Prizes at the Burbot Bash

Anglers can cash in on prizes while removing a threat to Flaming Gorge

Manila – There’s no ice yet, but anglers are already talking about the 2016 Burbot Bash. The annual event is the perfect way to have fun catching fish while helping manage the great fishery at Flaming Gorge Reservoir.

The Burbot Bash started in 2009 and has expanded from an on-ice clinic held by members of BigFish-Tackle.com to a major prize event organized by the Flaming Gorge Chamber of Commerce. In 2016, the contest will be held January 22- 24th and cash prizes of up to \$10,000 will be awarded.

Bash organizers say prizes will be offered in several categories. Participants enter the contest as teams of up to four members and will then compete for the most fish and biggest fish caught categories. A minimum of three places will be awarded in each category. Those who catch the most Burbot will win a first-place prize of \$1,500 and those who catch the biggest will win \$1,000. In addition, young anglers can compete for the biggest Burbot caught, and the smallest Burbot caught, in a separate youth category.

Participants also have the chance to enter a couple of tagged fish contests. Before the Burbot Bash, biologists from Utah and Wyoming will tag 60 Burbot. If you catch a Burbot that’s been tagged any time since 2011, the tag will be entered in the Burbot Bounty. Everyone entered in the bounty will get an equal portion of the prize. Three of this year’s tag numbers will also be preselected for the big cash prizes worth \$1,000, \$2,500 and \$10,000! They’ll be announced at the closing ceremony on January 24th.

This year’s tags are internal so you must get all of your fish scanned at a check station to learn whether any of the Burbot you caught have tags in them.

“Tagged fish contests are great because they level the playing field,” says Ryan Mosley, Flaming Gorge project leader for the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources. “One angler can catch a single Burbot and potentially take home more money than those who check in hundreds.”

Finally, another cash opportunity is available for those who enter both the Burbot Bash and the Buckboard Burbot Classic scheduled the following weekend on January 29-31st. Both contest organizers have generously put \$500 into a pot and participants who enter both events could be randomly selected to win an additional \$1000. The random drawing will occur at the end of the Buckboard Burbot Classic.

Help Flaming Gorge

In addition to providing anglers with a fun way to earn cash and prizes, the Burbot Bash and other fishing efforts help the fishery in Flaming Gorge several ways:

Burbot are an invasive species that were introduced illegally into the upper Green River and Flaming Gorge Reservoir. Their voracious appetites are a serious concern for managers who are trying to maintain the quality fishing opportunities that have made Flaming Gorge Reservoir so famous.

Taking Burbot during and before the contests helps remove these unwanted fish. Past contests have removed a considerable number of Burbot. For example, during the 2013 Burbot Bash, a total of 4,287 Burbot were removed in only two nights! Harvesting Burbot will help reduce the impacts they have on popular sport fish in the reservoir, including kokanee salmon and smallmouth bass.

Tagged fish (used for the contest) provide biologists with valuable information about Burbot, including annual growth rates and movement throughout the reservoir.

Anglers also support local businesses during the Bash and fishing before the event begins. Many restaurants, lodging establishments and supply stores, which are typically closed in the winter, stay open for the Burbot Bash and the revenue it brings in.
