


After graduating from Manila High School, he attended Dixie College for two years. He graduated from there with an Associate's Degree and then attended Utah State University and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Range Science.

In the mid 1970's Glen returned to the family ranch to help his Dad. After the death of his father, John Tinker, he took over the management of the family ranch in Manila, UT.

During Glen's time on the ranch, he has helped change the ranch from strictly a flood irrigation system to sprinkler systems on most of the ranch land in Utah.

In 2003, Glen was elected to the Board of

Directors of the Sheep Creek Irrigation Company. Glen took over the duties of the Secretary of the irrigation company in 2005.

Glen Tinker is "the salt of the Earth" type of guy. He enjoys the land and the mountains around Manila, UT. Glen's true pleasure and joy was raising his family in Daggett County on the land that he loves.

## KEEGAN THOMPSON IMPROVING

Keegan Thompson was involved in a sledding accident on Dec. 28 while visiting his grandparents in Mt. Pleasant Utah. He was riding on an old wooden runner sled when he lost control and hit a parked truck. The Dr's at Sanpete Valley Hospital determined from x-rays and a CT scan that he had broken his skull and had bleeding that was putting pressure against his

brain. He was life-flighted from Mt. Pleasant Utah to Primary Children's hospital where he underwent surgery to relieve the bleeding on his brain and also screw in a plate of bone to help the cracked skull. He spent 7 days in Primary's Children's Hospital but is now home and trying to take it easy so his brain trauma can heal.

He is doing better everyday and is healing nicely.

## 2016 BURBOT BASH

The sun has finally set on the 2016 Burbot Bash.

Ice conditions were great this year, with ice all the way down into Utah, ending in Sheep Creek Bay. A snow storm hit the middle of the second night, dumping about 6-inches in just a few hours. As a result, catch rates were slightly lower on Day #2 and many anglers had difficulty getting off the ice and back to the paved roads.

A total of 3,604 Burbot were caught/harvested by 640 anglers in just two nights. Of those

fish, seven were tag recaptures. One Burbot was originally tagged and released back in 2012. It moved 32-miles down-lake and grew about 12-inches during that time period. None of the tagged fish were worth grand prizes, but each of those lucky anglers walked away with \$200.

Due to the high participation and increased tournament revenue, the Flaming Gorge Chamber of Commerce increased pay-outs by 25% and out to ten places, awarding over \$25,000 in cash and

prizes!

The Most Burbot was won by Team Asay, with a two-night total of 157 Burbot paying \$1,800. The Largest Burbot caught was 33.1 inches and 7.9 lbs by Tim Goss paying \$1,300, and Smallest Burbot was 7.5 inches by Youth Angler, Aaron Sprecher, paying \$125.

The closing ceremony was emceed by Adam Eakle, and included breakfast by the Villa, a free Burbot fry by Browning's, and several door prizes donated by generous businesses and sponsors.

### Get Involved In Your Community

There has been long-standing citizen involvement in the planning of Daggett County. Your Planning & Zoning (P&Z) board has lost 2 long term members, Stew Leith and Ryan Morgan. We thank them for their dedicated service.

Daggett County is looking for two volunteer board members. As a member on the Planning & Zoning Board it can positively impact the quality of life in your community, get involved with issues, projects, and programs. There is a lot going on this year and there has never been a better time to get involved in your community!! Decisions and plans that are decided by the P&Z board can have

an effect on property values. The P&Z Board meets only once a month so it is just a little of your time needed to make such a huge impact in your community! At this time the board is meeting at least twice a month with everything that is going on in the County. That is just temporary until the County Resource Management Plan (CRMP) is done and the codification of the County Ordinances is complete. Planning & Zoning provides citizens with an opportunity for involvement in advising the County Commissioners, and other decision-makers on development projects, general or community plan amendments, re-zonings and public facilities. The recommendations of P&Z

are integral components of the planning process, and are highly regarded by the County Commissioners. Planning & Zoning focuses on establishing a long-term vision for development of the community and reviewing development proposals for consistency with that vision. There has never been a more important time than now to get involved. Daggett County is required to prepare a County Resource Management Plan (CRMP) detailing the county's plans for the use, development, protection, and management of public resources within its boundaries. This CRMP will then be used to coordinate with federal agencies as they update their Federal Land Management Plans.

## THE ORIGIN OF VALENTINES DAY

St. Valentine's Day began as a liturgical celebration of one or more early Christian saints named Valentines. A popular account of Saint Valentine of Rome states that he was imprisoned for performing weddings for soldiers who were forbidden to marry and for ministering to Christians, who were persecuted under the Roman Empire. According to legend, during his imprisonment, he healed the daughter of his jailer, Asterius. An embellishment to

this story states that before his execution he wrote her a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell. The day was first associated with romantic love in the circle of Geoffrey Chaucer in the High Middle Ages, when the tradition of courtly love flourished. In 18th-century England, it evolved into an occasion in which lovers expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards, (known as

"valentines"). In Europe, Saint Valentine's Keys are given to lovers "as a romantic symbol and an invitation to unlock the giver's heart", as well as to children, in order to ward off epilepsy (called Saint Valentine's Malady). <sup>[6]</sup> Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heart-shaped outline, doves, and the figure of the winged Cupid. Since the 19th century, handwritten valentines have given way to mass-produced greeting cards.
